The data does not include conversations, sounds, or images inside the vehicle or personal information that could identify the owner. Toyota Safety Sense 3.0 records this data in certain situations, such as collisions, traffic congestion, poor road surfaces, or specific roads. This information is obtained when the vehicle is brought to a dealership or sent to Toyota servers. The recorded data may be used for collision analysis, malfunction diagnosis, automated driving, advanced safety technologies, and map-related products. Data may also be used for customer support after a collision or to resolve issues. In some cases, Toyota may disclose this data to third parties with the vehicle owner's consent, at the request of authorities, in lawsuits, or for research purposes. In addition, Toyota may share recorded data with third parties under specific circumstances, including when the vehicle owner gives separate consent. This includes situations where users subscribe to services that require data sharing. When you use your Toyota vehicle, certain data is recorded and may be shared with third-party companies for research and development purposes. This data includes information about your vehicle's location, speed, and direction. The company providing this service must have obtained your consent before sharing your data. Your data can be used in various ways, such as: * To improve autonomous driving software * For map creation and maintenance * To support local government road maintenance efforts * For traffic condition communication services * In emergency situations, like fires or accidents You have the right to erase recorded image information from your vehicle through your Toyota dealer. However, disabling the image recording function may limit access to certain data. If you want to stop collecting and sharing Toyota Safety Sense 3.0 data, contact your Toyota dealer. However, federal law allows manufacturers to deny warranty coverage if an aftermarket part causes damage to another covered part. This vehicle comes with a free warranty or has obtained a waiver from the Federal Trade Commission. It is equipped with an event data recorder (EDR) that helps to understand how the vehicle's systems performed in certain situations like crashes or near-crashes. The EDR records data on vehicle dynamics and safety for up to 30 seconds, including information about the driver's actions and vehicle speed. This data can be useful in investigating accidents. However, it is not recorded under normal driving conditions and does not include personal information. Only specialized equipment can read the EDR data, which can be accessed by law enforcement or the manufacturer if necessary. Toyota won't share EDR data with third parties unless they have permission from the vehicle owner or are required to do so by authorities. The company might use the data for research purposes, but this would not involve identifying individual vehicles or owners. It's also worth noting that some components in your Toyota may contain perchlorate, which requires special handling when disposing of them. Additionally, it's essential to remove and dispose of SRS airbag and seat belt pretensioner devices properly before scrapping the vehicle to avoid potential fires. Looking after your vehicle is crucial for safety reasons, particularly when it's under the influence of alcohol or drugs. These substances impair your ability to operate the vehicle properly, leading to delayed reaction times, poor judgment, and reduced coordination. This can result in accidents that could be fatal. To avoid such incidents, always drive defensively by anticipating potential mistakes made by other drivers or pedestrians. Additionally, stay focused on driving and avoid distractions like adjusting controls, using a cellular phone, or reading while driving. It's also important to keep children safe in the vehicle. Never leave them unattended, and ensure they don't have access to the keys. Children might inadvertently start the car or adjust settings, posing a risk to themselves or others. Moreover, the vehicle's internal temperature can be hazardous for children, especially when it comes to extreme heat or cold. The owner's manual provides crucial information on using the vehicle safely and responsibly. For the winter season, refer to page 439 in the owner's manual. To prevent windshield wiper freezing, use a de-icer as described on pages 447 and 453. Adjusting the outside rearview mirror is explained on page 172. When folding the mirrors, consult page 173. For demisting the mirrors, see pages 445 and 451. The fuel filler door's operation is detailed on page 241, along with the refueling method. Find information about the fuel type and tank capacity on page 615. Instructions for locking and unlocking side doors are located on page 130, while opening and closing side windows is covered on page 174. Mechanical key usage for locking and unlocking is found on page 598. Warning messages can be viewed on page 568. Tire-related information includes size and inflation pressure (pages 532 and 620), winter tires or tire chains (page 439), and the checking, rotation, and tire pressure warning system (page 532). If you encounter a flat tire, follow the instructions on page 585. The operation of side marker lights is described on page 232. Headlights, daytime running lights, turn signal lights, parking lights, license plate lights, and tail lights all have their own sections on this page. Additionally, back-up lights are covered in the same section. Additional features such as the Parking Brake Switch, Precautions for Winter Season (P.440), Warning Buzzer/Messages (P.228, 573), and Brake Hold Switch are also mentioned. The Mode Select Switch and Tow Haul Switch can be found on pages P.220 and P.402, while the MTS Switch is located on page P.413. Furthermore, the DAC/Crawl Switch, iMT Switch, ECT PWR Switch, Front-Wheel Drive Control Switch, Trailer Backup Guide Switch, Camera Switch, Rear Differential Lock Switch, and SDM (Stabilizer with Disconnection Mechanism) Switch are all listed in the provided documentation. Other notable switches include the Stop & Start Cancel Switch (P.302), Clutch Start Cancel Switch (P.416), Outside Rear View Mirror Switches (P.172), Door Lock Switches (P.133), Power Window Switches (P.174), and Window Lock Switch (P.176). Lastly, the Meter Control Switches are located on pages P.99 and P.108, while the Phone Switch and Cruise Control Switch can be found on page P.284. A guide to features and components of a vehicle, starting from page 264 with audio remote control switches and continuing through various sections.
