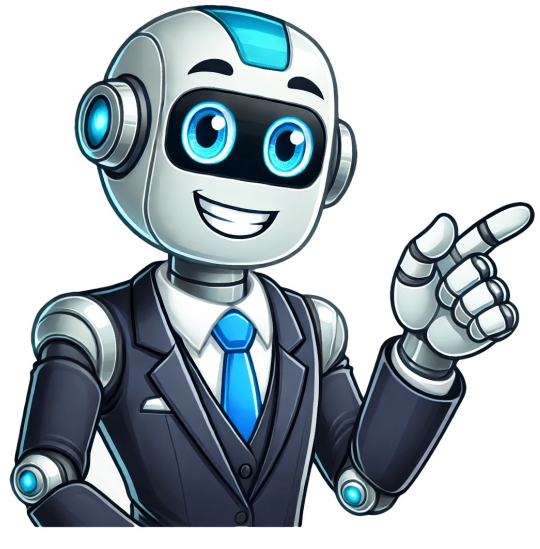

Who said that real heroes can't be found among bookstores? Behind the bright lights of New York City, there are amazing and cozy bookstores waiting to be discovered. Here's our list of 11 top used bookstores in New York City: 1. Bauman Rare Books - an upscale bookstore with rare editions from the 16th century and more. Shop online or visit their Manhattan store. 2. Westsider Rare & Used Books Inc. - a hidden gem on Broadway, featuring fiction, poetry, philosophy books, and some rare leather-bound editions. Buy online through ABEBOOKS.com or Amazon.com or visit their store. Contact them beforehand for specific titles. 3. East Village Books - a popular bookstore in Manhattan with scholarly subjects like philosophy, music, cults, and more. Accepts cash only.
