Adjust the strap until it fits snugly. To loosen or tighten, move the strap through the Slide Buckle then pull through the Fasten Buckle. Don't wear the collar for more than 12 hours to prevent irritation. For a proper fit, trim the excess strap if needed, leaving space for your dog's growth. Now, follow these steps: Mark the strap at least 2 inches past the slide buckle and remove the collar. Trim the excess strap if needed, leaving space for your dog's growth. It's crucial to secure the collar correctly, as an ill-fitting one can cause skin irritation ranging from redness to bed sores. If a rash or sore appears, discontinue collar usage until it heals. For pets sensitive to contact pressure, using stainless steel contacts is recommended. Regularly check your pet's tolerance for the collar and test the containment field width after adjustments to prevent unintended corrections. When using a collar and leash, ensure the extra collar before performing transmitter testing. Avoid using AC circuits protected by GFCI or RCD. Remove clear plastic cover with Test Light D Tool to expose Correction Level Button (D). 2. Press and release Correction Level Button when Receiver Indicator Light is lit up (E). 3. Series of flashes from Receiver Indicator Light represent current Static Correction Level. 4. If collar set at level 2 or above, it automatically increases correction level based on pet's time in zone. 5. Low battery indicator flashes every 4-5 seconds. In the unlikely event of over-correction, this feature limits static correction duration to 30 seconds. To determine the desired pet area, first place the base unit indoors and ensure it is two to four feet above ground level. The location should be weatherproof and at least three feet away from metal or appliances. Once you've determined the size of the fence, place the base unit in the middle of the desired area. Follow these steps: connect the adapter to the power jack on the base unit, plug it into a standard electrical outlet, and set the stimulation level for the collar using the test light tool. To install the battery, use the battery, use the battery key and twist to lock. Align the arrow with the lock symbol to turn on the collar beeps and the test light tool flashes. Training is vital for your pet to understand the designated area, covering topics like settings, boundaries, distractions, and eventually off-leash training within the area. Each session lasts 10-15 minutes, three times daily, with a minimum recommended duration of 14 days. End each session with at least 5 minutes of playtime. Be aware that the first battery might drain quicker due to frequent use during the initial training phase.
